Suceava/Romania 14 -18 April 2013

1.How do you evaluate the program of the project meeting in Romania?

2.What did you learn about Romania and Romanian people?

- Thanks to our communication with teachers and students and to the trips that were organized, it was possible to get to know the reality of what's going on in Romania and in particular, Romania's people. We saw people that have to deal with complicated political,

economical and social circumstances, but yet still have firm convictions of freedom and democracy and a strong passion to fight for progress in their country. We have been able to get to know first hand the situation the country and it's people went through during the long years of it's previous political era. And we have also been able to see how the young people – at least, the students we have seen and spoken to – have a great passion for knowledge, an enormous capability for the study of foreign languages, in certain cases a big artistic talent and a magnificent attitude to taking part and hospitality. /Spain/

- We learnt about customs, housing old and modern, landscape in his history and geology, the variety of churches and history of the monasteries. The people were friendly./Germany/
