

International Comenius Meeting **To see is to know. All our destinations**. TOKI ANADOLU LISESI Karaman/Turkey 19. – 23. May 2012

1. How do you evaluate the program of the project meeting in Turkey ?

- The program we attended in Turkey was quite well organized including a series of very interesting historic sights. They managed to make good presentations and to answer all questions of the foreign teams.
- We are impressed of the program and how easy they managed to follow it. Everything seemed to work without serious problems. The program had a good balance between work with the project and sightseeing/tours. We liked the idea that students work together by their own. We would have liked to receive the program earlier.

- Special for the young ones, the meeting with Turkish culture is of great value. We may think because of globalisation that our cultures are more similar than they really are. And also for the adults this cultural experiences are of great value.
- In general, it was the cultural exchange among teachers and students and the opportunity to travel to other countries.
